📐 Garbage Disposal Guidelines

- Please work together with others to keep the garbage collection area clean.
- Sort your garbage by type and place it in the designated area by 8:00 a.m. on collection days.
- Avoid putting garbage out the night before, as it may attract crows and other animals that could create a mess.
- Use transparent or semi-transparent bags for garbage disposal.

Noise Considerations

Japanese homes are often less soundproof than those in other countries, so please be mindful of noise. Keep TV volume and conversations low, especially during late-night and early-morning hours, to avoid disturbing neighbors.

Traffic Safety

Pedestrians should keep to the right, while vehicles, motorbikes, and bicycles should keep to the left. Always follow traffic lights and signs, and use crosswalks to cross the road.

Local Districts and Neighborhood Associations

In Ina Town, there are 23 districts. Residents in each district work together on various activities to build a better community. Joining a district or neighborhood association is encouraged to promote cooperation and mutual support in the area.

District Activities

Information Sharing

We distribute town announcements and neighborhood updates, including through *Koho Ina* (広報いな), the town newsletter.

Community Support

We prepare for potential emergencies and disasters together. Regular patrols help keep the neighborhood safe. We manage garbage collection areas and organize street cleanups to maintain a tidy community.

Recreation

We host community events like summer festivals and Sports Day, and participate in larger town events and festivals.

Fundraising

Local residents participate in community donation drives.

Even if you aren't a member of a district or neighborhood association, cooperation is essential during emergencies. Building good relationships with neighbors through simple greetings and regular interaction will make it easier to support each other in times of need.



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
Output States Three Key Points to Remember



Personal Safety During Disasters: When a disaster occurs (such as a major earthquake (natural phenomena that cause the ground to shake) or heavy rain), prioritize your safety.

Depending on the situation, evacuate to an evacuation shelter or a safe location.

*Evacuation shelters are designated places for people to gather during emergencies like earthquakes or severe weather. The Disaster prevention map of Ina provides information on evacuation shelter locations and what you should prepare, so please review it and keep it accessible.





Emergency Calls (Fire and Ambulance): If there's a fire or you need to call an ambulance, dial 119!

 $\textcircled{\sc learly}$ state whether there is a fire, an injury, or someone unable to evacuate.

(2) Provide the location accurately. If you're unsure, mention a nearby landmark.

③Explain the details of the fire or accident.

*If you're uncertain whether you need an ambulance, call #7119 for advice from the Emergency Telephone Consultation Center.



Reporting Incidents or Crimes: If you encounter an incident or crime, call 110!

It's natural to panic in emergencies, but try to remain calm.

- \bigcirc Indicate whether it's a crime or an accident.
- ⁽²⁾Provide the location and time of the incident. If you're unsure, mention a nearby landmark.
- ③Describe the situation (crime or accident).
- (4) Provide as much information as possible about the perpetrator (number of individuals, clothing description, and the direction they fled).






Ina Town offers a volunteer Japanese language class that welcomes drop-in attendees. If you'd like to get in touch before attending, feel free to email the following organization.




